
Reflection on my stay at Senja videregående skole

was able to discover a new culture in a Norwegian family. I think we


were lucky to have experienced the Northern lights, snow, reindeer but also the unique landscape of Senja with its fjords.

Norwegian schools

Therefore, there is a certain distance between us which can sometime be quite stressful as they are not as comprehensive as Norwegian teachers. They expect us to be devoted to our studies as our days are much more longer and we have a lot of homework during the vacations and the week-ends. Rest time is quite rare in

France and we are not able to do a lot of physical





activities. Nevertheless, the French systems offers a rigorous frame which prepares us for the future. However, I find the Norwegian system a little relaxed because we are able to eat in the classes, talk and to take it slow but I think it is just a cultural difference.

Norway

For France, all the Northern countries are role models because they have a better school and political system. I enjoyed the safety of this region it is very pleasant to not worry of being robbed or harassed in the streets. The landscapes are insane, and I really enjoyed living this experience in the arctic circle.

The Norwegian culture and way of life Norwegian people are very welcoming and open minded. They put a lot of importance to recreational activities and health. They also eat earlier than in

France and they balance work and rest which is less stressful. They are also very close to their families whereas in France we talk less to our families which can be quite sad. Norway is a rich country and there are not a lot of disparities between the rich and the poor. On the other hand, France has a lot of historical monuments which can lack in Norway.

Recommendation of using the Erasmus+ programme:
